The North Country Institute and Retreat a) provides a retreat and institute for emerging and established writers of color, b) provides writers of color with an opportunity to draw upon their experiences as writers in a racialized society and c) provides the broader New York State area with an opportunity to become knowledgeable about the issues and concerns facing writers of color. Writing fellows are invited to study the genres of fiction, poetry, and memoir.

Frequently Asked Questions

1. **Can students apply?** Yes. Students at the upper level of high school and above may apply. If in high school they should be exceptional in the genre of writing for which they are submitting an application.
2. **Do I have to be a professional writer?** No. Anyone with an interest in the craft may apply.
3. **How are Fellows selected?** Fellows are selected by a committee that includes writing instructors, writers and other qualified individuals for the genre. All recommendations for potential writing fellows and sample writings are reviewed.
4. **Do I have to submit my references *with* the application?** No. References may be submitted separately via mail or internet to writers@mec.cuny.edu with your name and "NCI" in the subject heading. References must be received at least one to two weeks prior to the first day of the scheduled retreat.

Notes: Applications received without the \$25 application fee will be considered incomplete until the payment is received by the Center for Black Literature.

History of the Retreat

The first three retreats were held in northeastern New York at the Valcour Educational and Conference Center overlooking Lake Champlain and the Fourth Annual Retreat was held at Medgar Evers College. The Retreat is a collaboration between several organizations and is a continuation and expansion of the alumni program for the Paden Institute and Retreat for Writers of Color.

The North Country Institute and Retreat for Writers of Color developed in response to the Paden Retreat for Writers of Color which provides writers with an opportunity to work on their writing in a cottage located in Essex, New York. In August 2003, alumni from the Paden Retreat came together and held a series of readings in Elizabethtown, New York. This event was co-sponsored by the Adirondack Center for Writing, John Brown Lives, the Alice Moore Foundation, the Center for Black Literature at Medgar Evers College, and the Center for Law and Social Justice at SUNY, Albany. Former Paden writing residents, Brenda Greene from Medgar Evers College, CUNY and Jose Torres from SUNY, Plattsburgh, came together, established an advisory board and created the North Country Institute and Retreat www.plattsburgh.edu/offices/academic/writersofcolor at Valcour, New York.

Funding for the First and Second Annual Retreat was provided by the Nathan Cummings Foundation and the Winkel Foundation. Faculty mentors for the first retreat in July 2004, included poet, Sonia Sanchez; fiction writer, Indira Ganesan; and poet, essayist, and children's author, Tony Medina. The second retreat was held in June, 2005 and included nationally renowned poet, Martin Espada, journalist, non-fiction and memoir writer, Patrice Gaines and novelist Sandra Jackson-Opoku. Award-winning poet and memoirist Ethelbert Miller and fiction writer and poet and novelist Jeffrey Renard Allen were faculty leaders for the Third Annual North County Retreat and Institute. Funding for this retreat was provided by the Winkel Foundation at SUNY, Plattsburgh and the Center for Black Literature at Medgar Evers College. The Fourth Annual Retreat at Medgar Evers College featured poet, Gregory Pardlo and fiction writer Victor LaValle.

As a result of the challenges related to supporting a retreat for a small number of writing residents (12 at the Valcour Educational and Conference Center) and in response to our desire to impact more writers of color in the New York City area and to expand the number of writers of color who can benefit from the retreat and institute, we have restructured the North Country Institute and Retreat for Writers of Color to include venues at Medgar Evers College as well as Valcour, New York.
